## Instrument of Govemment 1 August 2017 as amended

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## 1. Inteppretation of the terms used

In this Instrument of Govemment-
(a) any reference to "the Principal" shall include a person acting as Principal;
(b) "the Director of Govemance" means the Clerk to the Corporation;
(c) "the Comoration" meansthe Comoration of East Coast College;
(d) "the institution" meansthe East Coast College and any institution for the time being conducted by the Corporation in exerc ise of its powers under the Further and Higher Educ ation Act 1992 ${ }^{(1)}$;
(e) "this Instrument" means this Instrument of Govemment;
(f) "the CE of Skills Funding" means the Chief Exec utive of Skills Funding
(g) "meeting" includesa meeting at which the members attending are present in more than one room, provided that by the use of conferencing facilities it is possible for every person present at the meeting to communicate with each other;
(h) "necessary skills" means skills and experience, other than professional qualific ations, specified by the Corporation as appropriate formembers to have;
(i) "staff member" and "student member" have the meanings given to them in clause 2;
(j) "the previous Instrument of Govemment" means the Instrument of Govemment relating to the Coporation which had effect immediately before 31 March 2017
(k) "the Secretary of State" means the Sec retary of State for Department for Education;
(I) "staff matters" means the remuneration, conditions of service, promotion, conduct, suspension, dismissal or retirement of staff;
(m) "the students' union" means a ny association of students formed to further the educational purposes of the institution and the interests of students, as students;
(n) a "variable category" means any category of members whose numbers may vary according to cla uses 2 and 3.

## 2. Composition of the Corporation

(1) The Coporation shall consist of:
(a) not more than normally fifteen independent members who appear to the Coporation to have the necessary skills to
ensure that the Comoration ca mies out its functions under article 3 of the Artic les of Govemment.
(b) the Principal of the institution, unless the Principal chooses not to be a member;
(c) at least one and not more than three members who are members of the institution's staff and have a contract of employment with the institution ("staff members");
(c) at least one and not more than three members who are students at the institution ("student members").
(2) A person, who is not for the time being enrolled as a student at the institution, shall nevertheless be treated as a student during any period of authorised absence from the institution for study, travel or for camying out the duties of a ny office held by that person in the institution's students' union.
(3) The appointing authority, as set out in clause 4, will decide whether a person is eligible fornomination, election and appointment as a member of the Corporation under paragraph (1).

## 3. Determination of membership numbers

(1) The Corporation may at a ny time vary the determination referred to in paragraph (1) and any subsequent detemination under this paragraph provided that-
(a) the number of members of the Corporation shall not be fewer than twelve; and
(b) the numbers of members of each variable category shall be subject to the limit which applies to that category set out in Clause 2.
(2) No determination under this cla use shall temina te the a ppointment of a ny person who is already a member of the Corporation at the time when the determination is made.
4. Appointment of the members of the Comporation
(1) Subject to paragraph (2) the Corporation is the appointing authority in relation to the a ppointment of its members.
(2) If the number of members falls below the number needed for a quorum, the Secretary of State is the a ppointing authority in relation to the appointment of those members needed for a quorum.
(3) The appointing authority may decline to appoint a person asa memberif-
(a) it is satisfied that the person has been removed from office as a member of a further education comoration in the previous ten years; or
(b) the appointment of the person would contravene any rule or byelaw made under article 20 of the Artic les of Govemment conceming the number of terms of office which a person may serve, provided that such rules or byelaws make the
same provision foreach category of members appointed by the appointing authority; or
(c) the person is ineligible to be a member of the Comoration because of clause 8.
(4) Where the office of any member becomes vacant the appointing a uthority shall as soon as practic able take all necessary steps to appoint a new member to fill the vacancy.

## 5. Appointment of the Chair and Vice-Chair(s)

(1) The members of the Corporation shall appoint a Chair and ViceChair(s) from among themselves.
(2) Neither the Principal nor any staff or student member shall be eligible to be appointed asChair or Vice-Chair(s) orto act as Chair in their absence.
(3) If both the Chair a nd Vice-Chair(s) are absent from any meeting of the Corporation, the members present shall choose someone from a mong themselvesto act as Chair for that meeting.
(4) The Chair and Vice-Chair(s) shall hold office forsuch period as the Coporation decides.
(5) The Chair or Vice-Chair(s) may resign from office at a ny time by giving notice in writing to the Director of Govemance.
(6) If the Comoration is satisfied that the Cha ir is unfit or unable to camy out the functions of office, it may give written notice, removing the Chair from office and the office shall then be vacant.
(7) If the Comoration is satisfied that a Vice-C ha ir is unfit or unable to camy out the functions of office, it may give written notice, removing the Vice-Chair from office and the office shall then be vacant.
(8) At the last meeting before the end of the tem of office of the Chair, or at the first meeting following the Chair's resignation or removal from office, the members shall appoint a replacement from among themselves.
(9) At the last meeting before the end of the term of office of a ViceChair, or at the first meeting following the Vice-Chair's resignation orremoval from office, the members shall appoint a replacement from among themselves.
(10) At the end of their respective tems of office, the Chair and ViceChair(s) shall be eligible for reappointment.
(11) Paragraph (10) is subject to a ny rule or byelaw made by the Comoration under article 20 of the Articles of Govemment conceming the number of terms of office which a person may serve.

## 6. Appointment of the Clerk to the Corporation (Director of Govemance)

(1) The Comoration shall a ppoint a person to serve asitsClerk, but the Principal may not be appointed as Clerk. The Clerk shall be known as Director of Govemance.
(2) In the temporary absence of the Director of Govemance, the Corporation shall appoint a person to serve as a temporary Clerk, but the Principal may not be appointed astemporary Clerk.
(3) Any reference in this Instrument to the Director of Govemance or Clerk shall include a temporary Clerk appointed underparagraph (2).
(4) Subject to clause 13, the Director of Govemance shall be entitled to attend all meetings of the Comoration and any of its committees.
(5) The Director of Govemance may also be a member of staff at the institution.

## 7. Persons who are ineligible to be members

(1) No one under the age of 18 years may be a member, except asa student member.
(2) The Director of Govemance may not be a member.
(3) A person who is a member of staff of the institution may not be, or continue as, a member, except as a staff memberor in the capacity of Principal.
(4) Paragraph (3) does not apply to a student who is employed by the Corporation in connection with the student's role as an officer of a students' union.
(5) Subject to paragraphs(6) and (7), a person shall be disqualified from holding, or from continuing to hold, office as a member, if that person has been adjudged bankrupt or is the subject of a banknuptcy restrictions order, an interim banknuptcy restrictions orderora bankruptcy restrictions undertaking within the meaning of the Insolvency Act 1986, or if that person has made a composition or a rrangement with creditors, including an individual voluntary a rangement.
(6) Where a person is disqualified by reason of having been adjudged bankrupt or by reason of being the subject of a bankruptcy restric tions order, an interim bankruptc y restric tions order or a ba nknuptc y restrictions underta king, that disqua lific ation shall cease:
(a) on that person's discharge from bankruptcy, unless the bankruptcy order has before then been annulled; or
(b) if the bankruptcy order is a nnulled, at the date of that a nnulment; or
(c) if the bankruptcy restric tions order is resc inded asa result of an application under section 375 of the Insolvency Act 1986, on the date so ordered by the court; or
(d) if the interim bankruptcy restrictions order is disc harged by the court, on the date of that discharge; or
(e) if the banknuptcy restric tions underta king is a nnulled, at the date of that annulment.
(7) A person shall be disqual lified from holding, or from continuing to hold, office as a memberfor the following:
(a) Unspent conviction for specified terrorism, money laundering or b ribery offences;
(b) Unspent conviction for contra vening a C ha rity Commission Order or Direction;
(c) Unspent conviction formisconduct in public office, perjury or perverting the course of justice;
(d) Unspent conviction for attempting, aiding or abetting any of the above offences;
(e) Disobeying a Charity Commission Order,
(f) Being on the sex offenders register,
(g) Unspent sanction for contempt of Court; or
(h) Being a designated persons under specific anti-terrorist legislation
(8) Where a person is disqualified by reason of his having made a composition or a rangement with creditors, including an individual voluntary a rrangement, and then pays the debts in full, the disqualification shall cease on the date on which the payment is completed and in any other case it shall cease on the expiration of three years from the date on which the terms of the deed of composition, a rangement or individual voluntary a ra ngement are fulfilled.
(9) Subject to paragraph (9), a person shall be disqualified from holding, or from continuing to hold, office as a member if:
(a) within the previous five years that person has been convicted, whether in the United Kingdom orelsewhere, of a ny offence and has received a sentence of imprisonment, whether suspended or not, for a period of three months or more, without the option of a fine; or
(b) within the previous twenty years that person has been convic ted as set out in sub-paragraph (a) and has received a sentence of imprisonment, whether suspended or not, for a period of more than two and a half years; or
(c) that person has at any time been convicted as set out in subparagraph (a) and has received a sentence of imprisonment, whether suspended or not, of more than five years.
(10) For the purpose of this regulation there shall be disregarded any conviction by or before a court outside the United Kingdom for an offence in respect of conduct which, if it had taken place in the United Kingdom, would not have constituted an offence under the law then in force a nywhere in the United Kingdom.
(11) Upon a member of the Coporation becoming disqualified from continuing to hold office under paragraphs (5) or (8), the member shall immediately give notice of that fact to the Clerk.

## 8. The term of office of a member

(1) A member of the Comoration shall hold and vacate office in accordance with the terms of the appointment, but the length of the term of office shall not exceed four years.
(2) Members retining at the end of their term of office shall be eligible for reappointment, and clause 4 shall apply to the reappointment of a member as it doesto the appointment of a member.
(3) Paragraph (2) is subject to any rule or byelaw made by the Comoration under article 20 of the Articles of Govemment conceming the number of terms of office which a person may serve.

## 9. Temmination of membership

(1) A member may resign from office at any time by giving notice in writing to the Director of Govemance.
(2) If at a ny time the Corporation is satisfied that a ny member-
(a) is unfit or unable to discharge the functions of a member; or
(b) has been absent from meetings of the Comoration for a period longer than six consecutive months without the permission of the Coporation or
(c) membership is no longer in the best interest of the Corporation for the individual to continue in office.
(d) Is disqua lified from acting as a charity trustee by virtue of the Chanties Act 2011.
the Corporation may, by notice in writing to that member, remove the member from office and the office shall then be vacant.
(3) Any person who is a member of the Coporation by virtue of being a member of the staff at the institution, including the Principal, shall cease to hold office upon ceasing to be a member of the staff a nd the office shall then be vacant.
(4) A student member shall cease to hold office -
(a) at the end of the student's final academic year, or at such other time in the yearafter ceasing to be a student as the Corporation may decide; or
(b) if expelled from the institution,
and the office shall then be vacant.
10. Members not to hold interests in matters relating to the institution
(1) A member to whom paragraph (2) applies shall -
(a) disclose to the Comoration the nature and extent of the interest; and
(b) if present at a meeting of the Coporation, or of any of its committees, at which such sup ply, contract or other matter as is mentioned in paragraph (2) is to be considered, not take part in the consideration or vote on any question with respect to it and not be counted in the quorum present at the meeting in relation to a resolution on which that member is not entitled to vote; and
(c) withdraw, if present at a meeting of the Comoration, orany of its committees, at which such supply, c ontra ct or other matter as is mentioned in paragraph (2) is to be considered, where required to do so by a majority of the members of the Corporation orcommittee present at the meeting.
(2) This paragraph appliesto a member who-
(a) has any fina ncial interest in-
(i) the supply of work to the institution, or the supply of goods for the purposes of the institution;
(ii) a ny contract or proposed contract conceming the institution; or
(iii) a ny other matter relating to the institution; or
(b) has any other interest of a type specified by the Corporation in any matter relating to the institution.
(3) This Clause shall not prevent the members considering and voting upon proposals for the Corporation to insure them against lia bilities incurred by them arising out of their office or the Corporation obta ining such insurance and paying the premium.
(4) Where the matter under consideration by the Comoration or any of its committees relates to the pay and conditions of all staff, or all staff in a particularclass, a staff member-
(a) need not disclose a financial interest; and
(b) may take part in the consideration of the matter, vote on any question with respect to it and count towards the quorum present at that meeting, provided that in so doing, the staff member acts in the best interests of the Comoration as a whole and does not seek to represent the interests of a ny other person orbody, but
(c) shall withdraw from the meeting if the matter is under negotiation with staff and the staff member is representing any of the staff concemed in those negotiations.
(5) The Direc tor of Govemance shall maintain a register of the interests of the members which have been disclosed and the register shall be made available during nomal office hours at the institution to a ny person wishing to inspect it.

## 11. Meetings

(1) The Comoration shall meet at least once in every term, and shall hold such other meetings as may be necessary.
(2) Subject to paragraphs (4) and (5) and to clause 13(4), all meetings shall be called by the Director of Govemance, who shall, at least seven calendardays before the date of the meeting, send to the members of the Corporation written notice of the meeting and a copy of the proposed agenda.
(3) If it is proposed to consider at any meeting the remuneration, conditions of service, conduct, suspension, dismissal or retirement of the Director of Govemance, the Chair shall, at least seven calendardays before the date of the meeting, send to the members a copy of the agenda item concemed, together with a ny relevant papers.
(4) A meeting of the Corporation, called a "special meeting", may be called at a ny time by the Chair or at the request in writing of any five members.
(5) Where the Chair, or in the Chair's sabsence a Vice-Chair, decidesthat there are matters requiring urgent consideration, the written notice convening the special meeting and a copy of the proposed agenda may be given within fewerthan seven calendardays.
(6) Every member shall act in the best interests of the Coporation and shall not be bound to speak or vote by mandates given by any other body or person.

## 12. Quorum

(1) Meetings of the Comoration shall be quorate if the number of members present is at least $40 \%$, rounded up, of the total number of members in post and entitled to vote on the issue under consideration.
(2) If the number of members present for a meeting of the Corporation does not constitute a quorum, the meeting shall not be held.
(3) If during a meeting of the Corporation there ceases to be a quorum, the meeting shall be terminated at once.
(4) If a meeting cannot be held orcannot continue forlack of a quorum, the Chair may call a special meeting as soon as it is convenient.

## 13. Proc eedings of meetings

(1) Every question to be decided at a meeting of the Corporation shall be decided by a majority of the votescast by members present and entitled to vote on the question, unless there is consensus.
(2) Where, at a meeting of the Corporation, there is an equal division of votes on a question to be decided, the Chair of the meeting shall have a second orcasting vote.
(3) A member may not vote by proxy or by way of postal vote.
(4) No resolution of the members may be rescinded or varied at a subsequent meeting unless consideration of the rescission or variation is a specific item of business on the agenda for that meeting.
(5) Except asprovided by procedures made pursuant to Article 16 of the Artic les of Govemment, a member of the Comoration who is a member of staff at the institution, including the Principal, shall withdraw -
(a) from that part of any meeting of the Comoration, or any of its committees, at which staff matters relating solely to that member of the staff, as distinct from staff matters relating to all members of staff or all members of staff in a partic ular class, are to be considered;
(b) from that part of a ny meeting of the Comoration, or a ny of its committees, at which that member's reappointment or the appointment of that member's successor is to be considered;
(c) from that part of a ny meeting of the Comoration, or any of its committees, at which the matter under consideration concems the pay or conditions of service of all members of staff, or all members of staff in a partic ular class, where the member of staff is acting as a representative (whether or not on behalf of a recognised trade union) of all members of staff or the class of staff (as the case may be); and
(d) if so required by a resolution of the other members present, from that part of any meeting of the Coporation or any of its committees, at which staff matters relating to a ny member of staff holding a post senior to that member's are to be considered, except those relating to the pay and conditions of all staff or all staff in a partic ular class.
(6) A Principal who has chosen not to be a member of the Comoration shall still be entitled to attend and speak, or otherwise communicate, at all meetings of the Coporation and any of its committees, except that the Principal shall withdraw in any case where the Principal would be required to withdraw under paragraph (5).
(7) A student member who is under the age of 18 shall not vote at a meeting of the Corporation, or any of its committees, on any question conceming any proposal:
(a) for the expenditure of money by the Comoration; or
(b) under which the Comoration, or any members of the Corporation, would enter into a ny contract, or would incur any debt or liability, whether immediate, contingent or otherwise.
(8) Except as provided by rulesmade under Article 18(3) of the Articles of Govemment relating to appeals and representations by students in disciplinary cases, a student member shall withdraw from that part of any meeting of the Corporation or any of its committees, at which a student's conduct, suspension or expulsion is to be considered.
(9) In any case where the Comoration, or any of its committees, is to disc uss staff matters relating to a member or prospective member of staff at the institution, a student member shall
(a) take no part in the consideration ordiscussion of that matter and not vote on any question with respect to it; and
(b) where required to do so by a majority of the members, other than student members, of the Comoration or committee present at the meeting, withdraw from the meeting.
(10) The Director of Govemance
(a) shall withdraw from that part of any meeting of the Corporation, or a ny of its committees, at which the Director of Govemance's remuneration, conditions of service, conduct, suspension, dismissal or retirement in his capacity of Clerk are to be considered; and
(b) where the Director of Govemance is a member of staff at the institution, they shall withdraw in any case where a member of the Comoration is required to withdraw under paragraph (5).
(11) If the Director of Govemance withdraws from a meeting, or part of a meeting, of the Comoration under paragraph (10), the Corporation shallappoint a person from among themselvesto act asClerk during this absence.
(12) If the Director of Govemance withdraws from a meeting, or part of a meeting, of a committee of the Corporation, the Corporation shall appoint a person from among themselvesto act as Clerk to the committee during this absence

## 14. Minutes

(1) Written minutes of every meeting of the Corporation shall be prepared, and, subject to paragraph (2), at every meeting of the Coporation the minutes of the last meeting shall be taken asan a genda item.
(2) Paragraph (1) shall not require the minutes of the last meeting to be taken as an agenda item at a special meeting, but where they are not taken, they shall be taken as an agenda item at the next meeting which is not a special meeting.
(3) Where minutes of a meeting are taken as an a genda item and agreed to be accurate, those minutes shall be signed as a true record by the Chair of the meeting.
(4) Separate minutes shall be ta ken of those parts of meetings from which staff members, the Principal, student members or the

Director of Govemance have withdrawn from a meeting in accordance with clause 13(5), (6), (8), (9) or (10) and such persons shall not be entitled to see the minutes of that part of the meeting or a ny papers relating to it.

## 15. Public access to meetings

The Corporation shall decide any question as to whether a person should be allowed to attend any of its meetings where that person is not a member, the Director of Govemance orthe Principal and in making its decision, it shall give consideration to clause 17(2).

## 16. Publication of minutes and papers

(1) Subject to paragraph (2), the Corporation shall ensure that a copy of -
(a) the agenda for every meeting of the Coporation;
(b) the draft minutes of every such meeting, if they have been approved by the Chair of the meeting;
(c) the signed minutes of every such meeting; and
(d) any report, document or other paper considered at any such meeting,
shall as soon aspossible be made available during normal office hours at the institution to a ny person wishing to inspect them.
(2) There shall be excluded from any item made available for inspection a ny material relating to -
(a) a named person employed at or proposed to be employed at the institution;
(b) a named student at, or candidate for admission to, the institution;
(c) the Director of Govemance; or
(d) any matter which, by reason of its nature, the Corporation is satisfied should be dealt with on a confidential basis.
(3) The Comoration shall ensure that a copy of the draft or signed minutes of every meeting of the Corporation, under paragraph (1), shall be placed on the institution's website, and shall, despite any rules the Comoration may make regarding the archiving of such material, remain on its website for a minimum period of 12 months.
(4) The Comoration shall regula lly review all material excluded from inspection under paragraph (2)(d) a nd make a ny such material available for inspection where it is satisfied that the reason for dealing with the matter on a confidential basis no longer applies, or where it considers that the public interest in disc losure outweighs that reason.

## 17. Copies of the Instrument of Govemment

A copy of this Instrument shall be given free of charge to every member of the Corporation and at a charge not exceeding the cost of copying orfree of charge to any other person who so requests a copy, and shall be available for inspection at the institution upon request, during normal office hours, to every member of staff a nd every student.
18. Change of name of the Coporation

The Corporation may change its name with the approval of the Sec retary of State.

## 19. Application of the seal

The application of the seal of the Corporation shall be authenticated by -
(a) the signature of either the C hair or of some other member authorised either generally or specially by the Corporation to act for that pupose; and
(b) the signature of a ny other member.

## Articles of Govemment

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## 1. Inteppretation of the temms used

In these Artic les of Govemment -
(a) any reference to "the Principal" shall include a person acting as Principal;
(b) "the Articles" means these Artic les of Govemment;
(c) "Chair" and "Vice-Chair" mean respectively the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Comoration appointed under clause 5 of the Instrument of G ovemment;
(d) "the Director of Govemance" has the same meaning as in the Instrument of G ovemment;
(e) "the Comoration" hasthe same meaning as in the Instrument of G ovemment;
(f) "the CE of Skills Funding" means the Chief Exec utive of Skills Funding.
(g) "staff member" and "student member" have the same meanings as in the Instrument of Govemment;
(h) "the Sec retary of State" means the Secretary of State for Business, Innovation and Skills;
(i) "senior post" means the post of Principal and such other senior posts as the Corporation may decide for the purposes of these Articles;
(j) "the staff" means all the staff who have a contract of employment with the institution;
(k) "the students' union" has the same meaning as in the Instrument of Govemment.

## 2. Conduct of the institution

The institution shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Instrument of G ovemment, these Artic les, any rules or byela ws made under these Artic les and a ny trust deed regulating the institution.

## 3. Responsibilities of the Coporation, the Principal and the Director of Govemance

(1) The Corporation shall be responsible forthe following functions-
(a) the determination and periodic review of the educational character and mission of the institution and the oversight of its activities;
(b) publishing a rangements for obtaining the views of staff a nd students on the determination and periodic review of the educational characterand mission of the institution and the oversight of its a ctivities;
(c) approving the quality strategy of the institution;
(d) the effective and effic ient use of resources, the solvency of the institution and the Comoration and safeguarding their assets;
(e) approving a nnual estimates of income and expenditure;
(f) the appointment, grading, suspension, dismissal and determination of the pay and conditions of service of the holders of senior posts a nd the Director of Govemance, including, where the Director of Govemance is, or is to be appointed as, a member of staff, the Director of Govemance's appointment, grading, suspension, dismissal and determination of pay in the capacity of a member of staff; and
(g) setting a framework for the pay and conditions of service of all other staff.
(2) Subject to the responsibilities of the Comoration, the Princ ipal shall be the Chief Executive of the institution, and shall be responsible for the following functions-
(a) making proposals to the Comoration about the educational character and mission of the institution and implementing the decisions of the Corporation;
(b) the determination of the institution's academic and other activities;
(c) preparing a nnual estimates of income and expenditure for consideration and approval by the Comoration, and the mana gement of budget and resources within the estimates approved by the Coporation;
(d) the organisation, direction and management of the institution and leadership of the staff;
(e) the appointment, assignment, grading, appraisal, suspension, dismissal a nd determination, within the framework set by the Comoration, of the pay and conditions of service of staff, other than the holders of senior posts or the Director of Govemance, where the Director of Govemance is also a member of the staff; and
(f) maintaining student discipline and, within the rules and procedures provided for within these Artic les, suspending or expelling students on disc iplina ry grounds or expelling students foracademic reasons.
(3) The Director of Govemance shall be responsible for the following functions: -
(a) advising the Comoration with regard to the operation of its powers;
(b) advising the Corporation with regard to procedural matters;
(c) advising the Corporation with regard to the conduct of its business; and
(d) advising the Comoration with regard to matters of govemance practice.

## 4. The establishment of committees and delegation of functions generally

(1) The Coporation may establish committees for any pupose or function, other than those assigned in these Articlesto the Principal or Director of Govemance and may delegate powers to-
(a) such committees;
(b) the Chair, or in the Chair's absence, a Vice-C hair, or
(c) the Principal.
(2) The terms of reference of a ny committee, the number of members a nd the terms on which they are to hold and to vacate office, shall be decided by the Corporation.
(3) The Comoration may also establish committees under collaboration a rrangements made with otherfurther education institutions or ma inta ined schools (or with both), a nd such joint committees shall be subject to a ny regulations made under section 166 of the Education and InspectionsAct 2006(2) goveming such a rangements.

## 5. The Search Committee

(1) The Corporation shall establish a search committee, to be known as the "Govemance Remuneration and Search Committee", to advise on -
(a) the appointment of members; and
(b) such other matters relating to membership and appointments as the Comoration may ask it to.
(2) The Corporation shall not a ppoint any person as a member without first consulting and considering the advice of the search committee.
(3) The Comoration may make rules specifying the way in which the search committee is to be conducted. A copy of these rules, together with the search committee's terms of reference and its advice to the Comoration, other than any advice which the Corporation is satisfied should be dealt with on a confidential basis, shall be published on the institution's website and shall be made a vailable for inspection at the institution by any person during normal office hours.
(4) The Comoration shall review regula tly all material excluded from inspection under paragraph (3) and shall make any such material a vailable for inspection where it is satisfied that the reason for dealing with the matter on a confidential basis no longer applies, or where it considers that the public interest in disc losure outweighs that reason.

## 6. The Audit Committee

(1) The Corporation shall establish a committee, to be known as the "Audit Committee", to advise on matters relating to the Corporation's a udit a rrangements and systems of intemal control.
(2) The Audit Committee shall consist of at least three persons and may include members of staff at the institution with the exception of those in senior posts, and shall operate in accordance with any requirements of the CE of Skills Funding.

## 7. Composition of committees

Any committee established by the Corporation, other than the committee referred to in Article 10, may include persons who are not members of the Coporation.

## 8. Access to committees by non-members and publication of minutes

The Corporation shall ensure that:-
(a) a written sta tement of its policy regarding attendance at committee meetings by persons who are not committee members; and
(b) the minutes of committee meetings, if they have been approved by the Chair of the meeting,
are published on the institution's website and made available for inspection at the institution by a ny person, during normal office hours.
9. Delegable and non-delegable functions
(1) The Coporation shall not delegate the following functions
(a) the determination of the educational character and mission of the institution;
(b) the approval of the a nnual estimates of inc ome a nd expenditure;
(c) the responsibility for ensuring the solvency of the institution and the Coporation and for safeguarding their assets;
(d) the appointment of the Principal or holder of a senior post;
(e) the appointment of the Direc tor of Govemance (including, where the Director of Govemance is, or is to be, appointed as a member of staff the Director of Govemance 's appointment in the capacity asa member of staff); and
(f) the modification or revocation of these Articles.
(2) The Coporation may not delegate:
(a) the consideration of the case for dismissal, and
(b) the powerto detemine an appeal in connection with the dismissal
of the Principal, the Director of Govemance or the holder of a senior post, other than to a committee of members of the Coporation.
(3) The Comoration shall make rules specifying the way in which a committee having functions under paragraph (1) shall be established and conducted.
(4) The Principal may delegate functions to the holder of a ny other senior post, other than-
(a) the management of budget and resources; and
(b) any functions that have been delegated to the Principal by the Comoration.

## 10. Appointment and promotion of staff

(1) Where there is a vacancy orexpected vacancy in a senior post, the Corporation shall
(a) determine the a rrangements for the advertisement, selection and appointment of a successor, in line with curent employment legislation, the College equality policy and best practice; and
(b) appoint a selection panel consisting of-
(i) at least five members of the Comoration including the Chair or the Vice Chair or both, where the vacancy is for the post of Principal; or
(ii) the Principal and at least three other members of the Comoration, where the vacancy is for any other senior post.
(2) The members of the selection panel shall-
(a) decide on the a rrangements for selecting the applic a nts for interview;
(b) interview the applic ants; and
(c) where they consider it appropriate to do so, recommend to the Comoration for appointment one of the applicants they have interviewed.
(3) If the Coporation approvesthe recommendation of the selection panel, that person shall be appointed.
(4) If the members of the selection panel are unable to agree on a person to recommend to the Coporation, or if the Corporation does not approve their recommendation, the Corporation may make an appointment itself of a person from amongst those interviewed, or it may require the panel to repeat the steps specified in paragraph (2), with or without first re advertising the vacancy.
(5) Where there is a vacancy in a senior post or where the holder of a senior post is tempora rily absent, until that post is filled or the absent post holder retums, a member of staff -
(a) may be required to act asPrincipal or in the place of any other senior post holder; and
(b) if so required, shall have all the duties and responsibilities of the Principal or such other senior post holder during the period of the vacancy or temporary absence.
(6) The Principal shall have responsibility for selecting for a ppointment all members of staff other than-
(a) senior post holders; and
(b) where the Director of Govemance is also to be appointed as a member of staff, the Director of Govemance in the role of a member of staff.

## 11. Rules relating to the conduct of staff

After consultation with the staff, the Comoration shall make rules relating to their conduct.

## 12. Academic freedom

In making rules under Article 11, the Comoration shall have regard to the need to ensure that academic staff at the institution have freedom within the law to question and test received wisdom, and to put forward new ideas and controversial or unpopularopinions, without putting themselves at risk of losing their jobs or a ny privileges which they may enjoy at the institution.

## 13 Grievance, suspension and disc iplinary procedures

(1) After consulta tion with staff, the Comoration shall make rules setting out
(a) grieva nce procedures for all staff;
(b) procedures for the suspension of all staff; and
(c) disciplinary and dismissal procedures for
(i) senior post-holders, and
(ii) staff other than senior post-holders
and such procedures shall be subject to the provisions of Artic les 3(1)(f), 3(2)(e), 9(1)(d), 9(1)(e), 9(2) and 14.
(2) Any rules made under paragraph (1)(b) shall include provision that where a person has been suspended without pay, any appeal a gainst such suspension shall be heard and action taken in a timely manner.
(3) Any rules made under paragraph (1)(c )(i) shall include provision that where the Comoration considers that it may be appropriate to dismiss a person, a preliminary investigation shall be conducted to examine and determine the case fordismissal.
14. Suspension and dismissal of the Direc tor of Govemance
(1) Where the Director of Govemance is also a member of staff at the institution, the Director of Govemance is to be treated as a senior post holder for the puposes of a ricle 13 (1)(c).
(2) Where the Director of Govemance is suspended or dismissed under article 16, that suspension or dismissal shall not affect the position of the Director of Govemance in the separate role of Clerk to the Comoration.

## 15. Students

(1) Any students' union shall conduct and manage its own affairs and funds in accordance with a constitution approved by the Corporation and no amendment to, or rescission of, that constitution, in part or in whole, shall be valid unless approved by the Corporation.
(2) The students' union shall present a udited ac counts a nnually to the Coporation.
(3) After consultation with representatives of the students, the Corporation shall make rules conceming the conduct of students, including procedures for their suspension and expulsion (including expulsion for an unsa tisfac tory standard of work or other ac ademic reason).

## 16. Financial matters

The Corporation shall set the policy by which the tuition and other fees payable to it a re determined, subject to a ny terms and conditions attached to grants, loans or other payments paid or made by the CE of Skills Fund ing.

## 17. Co-operation with the CE of Skills Funding's auditor

The Comoration shall co-operate with any person who has been authorised by the CE of Skills Funding to a udit any retums of numbers of students or claims for financial assistance and shall give any such person access to any documents or records held by the Comoration, including computer records.

## 18. Intemal audit

(1) The Coporation shall, at such times as it considers ap prop riate, examine and evaluate its systems of intemal fina ncial and other
control to ensure that they contribute to the proper, economic, efficient and effective use of the Comoration's resources.
(2) The Corporation may a rrange for the examination and evaluation mentioned in paragraph (1) to be carried out on its behalf by intemal a uditors.
(3) The Coporation shall not appoint persons as intemal a uditors to camy out the activities referred to in paragraph (1) if those persons are already appointed as extemal auditors under article 22.

## 19. Ac counts and audit of accounts

(1) The Comoration shall -
(a) keep properaccounts and proper records in relation to the accounts; and
(b) prepare a statement of accounts foreach financial year of the Corporation.
(2) The statement shall -
(a) give a true and fair account of the state of the Comoration's affairs at the end of the financial yearand of its income and expenditure in the financial year; and
(b) comply with any directions given by the CE of Skills Funding as to the information to be contained in it, the manner in which the information is to be presented, the methods and principlesaccording to which it is to be prepared and the time and manner of public ation.
(3) The accounts and the statement shall be audited by extemal a uditors appointed by the Corporation in respect of each financial year.
(4) The Corporation shall not a ppoint persons a sextemal auditors in respect of any financial yearif those persons are already a ppointed as intemal a uditors under Artic le 21.
(5) Auditors shall be appointed and audit work conducted in accordance with a ny requirements of the CE of Skills Funding.
(6) The "fina ncial year" means the first financial year and, except as provided for in paragraph (8), each successive period of twelve months;
(7) The "first fina ncial year" means the period from the date the Corporation wasestablished up to the second $31^{\text {st }}$ J uly following that date, or up to some other date which has been chosen by the Coporation with the CE of Skills Fund ing's a pproval.
(8) If the Corporation is dissolved -
(a) the last financial year shall end on the date of dissolution; and
(b) the Corporation may decide, with the CE of Skills Funding's approval, that what would otherwise be the last two fina ncial years, shall be a single financial year for the purpose of this Article.

## 19. Rules and byelaws

The Corporation shall have the powerto make rules and byelaws relating to the govemment and conduct of the institution and these rules and byelaws shall be subject to the provisions of the Instrument of Govemment and these Articles.
20. Copies of Artic les of Govemment and rules and byelaws

A copy of these Articles, and of any rules and byela ws, shall be given free of charge to every member of the Comoration and at a charge not exceeding the cost of copying or free of charge, to any other person who requests a copy and shall be available for inspection at the institution upon request, during nomal office hours, to every member of staff and every student.

## 21. Modific ation or replacement of the Instrument and Artic les of Govemment

(1) Subject to paragraph (2) the Corporation may by resolution of the members modify or replace its instrument and artic les of govemment, after consultation with any other person who, in the Comoration's view, are likely to be affected by the proposed changes.
(2) The Comoration shall not make changes to the instrument and a ricles of govemment that would result in the body ceasing to be a charity.

## 22. Dissolution of the Comoration

(1) The Corporation may by resolution dissolve itself and provide for the tra nsfer of its property, rights a nd liabilities.
(2) The Corporation shall ensure that a copy of the draft resolution to dissolve the Comoration on a specified date shall be published at least one month before the proposed date of such resolution.
