1: Background	The Inclusive Economy Project and the James Paget Hospital have been working together to explore the role of anchor institutions in the local economy. For the James Paget Hospital, this includes working with local communities to promote its volunteering and job opportunities.
	An anchor institution is a large organisation that is rooted in a place and connected to their communities. These organisations include universities, local authorities, and hospitals. Their size means that they have the potential to influence the local economy through their spending power. They can do this by training and recruiting local people, and by developing local supply chains.
	<ul> <li>The Inclusive Economy Project is a Norfolk-wide project that is led by East Coast College and funded through the UK Government's Community Renewal Fund. The project has three main aims. These are: <ul> <li>To work with local communities to help people connect to employment support,</li> <li>To support the voluntary, community and social enterprise sector to create stepping-stone opportunities for people who face barriers to the labour market including health inequalities.</li> <li>To work with local employers including anchor institutions to support progression into longer term employment.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
2: About the opportunity	The Inclusive Economy Project (IEP) and the James Paget Hospital (JPH) are looking to work with the Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise (VCSE) Sector to develop and pilot a new anchor institution

	project. The project should contribute to more local
	people accessing volunteer and job opportunities with the hospital and its suppliers, with a focus on people and communities who face barriers to the labour market as a result of health inequalities.
	After developing a project plan, the VCSE organisation(s) will be expected to test their plan for engaging new volunteers through the use of a small-scale ground maintenance project. The IEP has access to a site for this purpose. Applicants can propose an alternative site for consideration, providing it is suitable, complies with health and safety, and is within the Great Yarmouth and surrounding area.
	Findings from this testing phase will support the VCSE organisation(s) and the James Paget Hospital to develop a feasibility plan for extending the ground maintenance work to the hospital grounds.
3: Timescale and resources	The IEP is making £10,000 development grant available to support this work. The grant needs to be fully spent by 31 December 2022. The successful applicant will need to be ready to start developing their project with the James Paget Hospital by Monday 3 <sup>rd</sup> October 2022.
4: Main objectives	Given the short timescales involved, applicants should view this work in three parts. These are:
	<ul> <li>Developing a project plan in partnership with the James Paget Hospital (October).</li> <li>Testing the plan with volunteers through the delivery of a volunteer ground maintenance project (November and December).</li> <li>Recording and evaluating impacts and using these to develop a feasibility plan with the James Paget Hospital for extending the ground maintenance project to the hospital grounds from January 2023 (October to December).</li> </ul>
5: Who can apply	This opportunity is open to voluntary, community and social enterprise organisations. Organisations can apply on their own or as part of a partnership. Where a partnership applies, there should be a lead applicant, who will be accountable for how the grant is used. The IEP only expects to award one grant.

6: Application process	The opportunity will open on Tuesday 30 <sup>th</sup> August 2022 and close at 9am on Tuesday 20 <sup>th</sup> September 2022. Interviews will take place on Friday 23 <sup>rd</sup> September and the successful applicant will be notified on Monday 26 <sup>th</sup> September 2022. The successful applicant should be ready to start developing their project with the James Paget Hospital from Monday 3 <sup>rd</sup> October 2022.
