CAREERS INFOMATION

The Careers Team can be found at all three of our campuses and we provide support to all of our students, apprentices and adult learners with information, advice and guidance to help students explore their options, plan pathways and navigate hurdles.

We run a number of college-wide events, support the curriculum with visits and employer engagement opportunities, as well as Higher Education application support. We provide one to one support for students exploring their options, trying out new ideas and provide support to those who are a bit more unsure.

How familiar are you with post-18 choices?

In a recent national survey, the majority of young people reported that parents and carers are the main source of career advice for them. This means that you need to feel confident with what the options are, and where to direct your young person if they have questions.

Apprenticeships:

<u>Amazing Apprenticeships</u> is a great source of information about Apprenticeships in general: what they are, how they work, and where to find them. If you prefer your information in a podcast you can download their Parenting Perspective podcast from the website.

UCAS: for information about higher and degree level Apprenticeships.

University:

<u>UCAS</u>: the hub for all applications to university; search for courses, get information on options, and how to support your young person through the application process and into university.

<u>Student Finance</u>: everything yoow open for 2024 course starts, if your young person is on a one-year course, or due to finish thinance applications for 2024 starts will be February 2024.

<u>Moneysavingexpert:</u> the UK's biggest consumer website focused on finding deals and offering money saving tips and advice.

Further Education:

Applications are now open for 2024 course starts, if your young person is on a one-year course, or due to finish their education in 2024 there are vocational options they may want to consider in order to take their learning in a new direction and explore different possibilities.

Other useful websites:

National Careers Service: explore over 800 career options, take a skills assessment, or start work on a CV.

<u>Prospect:</u> General careers advice, explore a database of careers, and get advice on applying for university and work.

<u>icanbea:</u> search for local employers, understand what they are looking for, and what opportunities are out there for young people. Video guides, interactive searches, and real-life insights into different careers.

WELLBEING WELCOME






