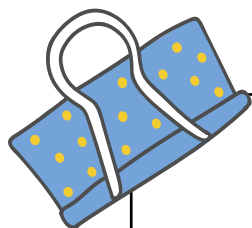

ED MILIBAND VISITS OUR ENERGY SKILLS CENTRE

We had a visit from the Labour Party, talking all things apprenticeships and energy. We were joined by Ed Miliband, Labour's Shadow Secretary of State of Climate Change and Net Zero, Bridget Phillipson, Labour's Shadow Secretary of State for Education and Jess Asato, Labour's candidate MP for Lowestoft.

Rachel Bunn, Director for Commercial, Projects and Community, led the tour of our state-of-the-art training facilities, allowing our guests to trial first-hand the incredible work our Energy Skills Centre does and how our facilities and training programmes facilitate this. Ed Miliband trialed our Hexis Working at Heights rig which helps train those who work on wind turbines, whilst Bridget Phillipson and Jess Asato tried their hands at our Maritime Bridge Simulator, navigating the waters of the Lowestoft Port. We were also joined by our apprentices working in the industry from Scottish Power and Armultra who discussed their experiences within the sector.

This was an incredible opportunity to showcase what Further Education can offer in the energy sector and how our college plays an integral part in this.

HEALTH AND SOCIAL TRIP TO BUDAPEST

Our Health and Social Care students travelled to Budapest as part of the Turing Scheme to learn about the health care and social care systems for both adults and young people visiting hospitals, schools and other relevant settings.

The group visited the Peto University and a nursing home to learn more about Budapest's healthcare, a SEN kindergarten to meet the children there and a drug rehab centre to meet patients in their programme.

The students also had the chance to partake in some tourist activities in their downtime, including the zoo, Margaret Island and St Stephens Basilica and were even able to see the Danube bank, a memorial to the Jewish people who were killed during the Holocaust, and the Holocaust Memorial Centre where they learned about Hungary's history during the Second World War.

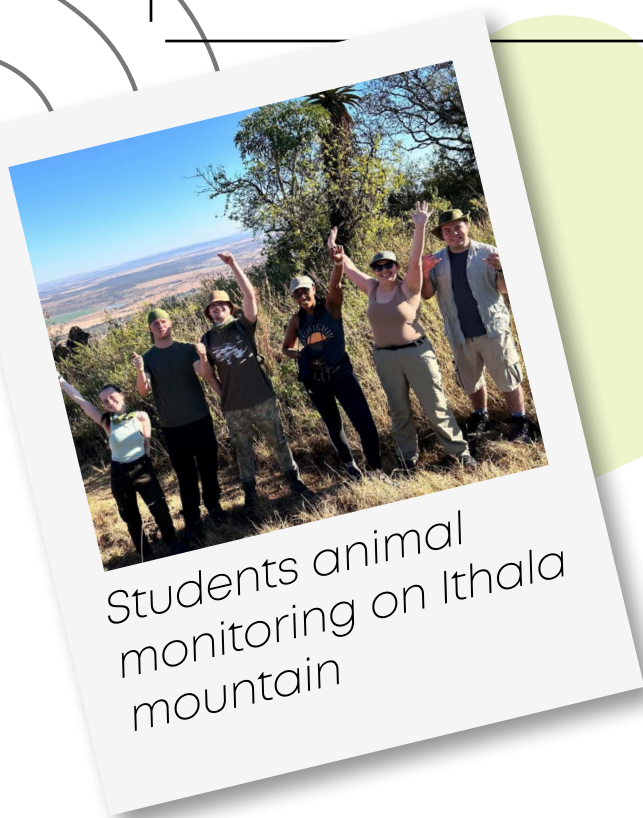

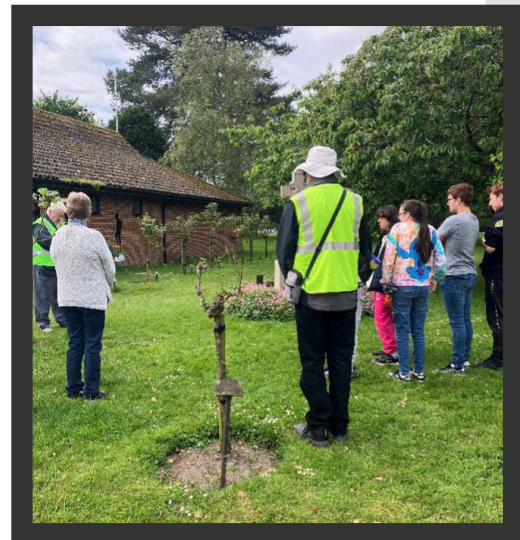
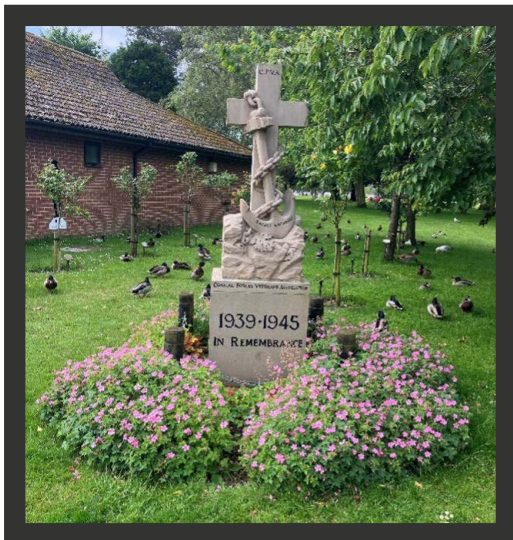

Our Health and Social Care Level 3 students at our Lowestoft campus participated in a workshop on resuscitation from The Red Cross.

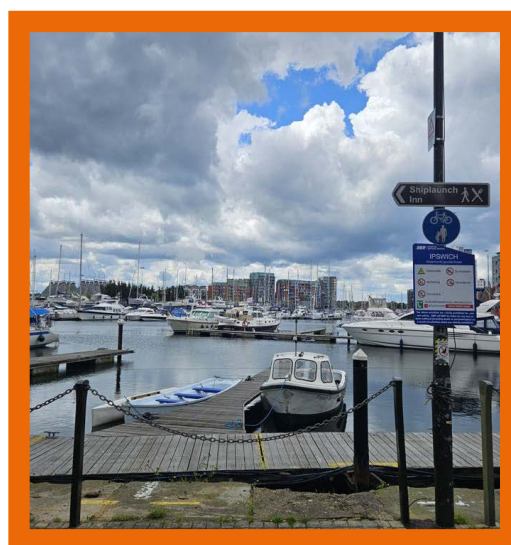
The trainer commented on how impressed she was with the students, their behaviour and how they interacted. Thank you to this team of students for being so professional and engaged during the workshop.
